APPROVAL TO CARRY SPARE LITHIUM ION BATTERIES

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN

This document provides approval to **members of the Australian Cinematographers Society**, travelling on Qantas Group aircraft, for the carriage of not more than two spare Lithium Ion Batteries, with a Watt-hour rating exceeding 100 Wh but not exceeding 160 Wh for consumer electronic devices, in carry-on baggage only. The batteries (no more than two) must be individually protected to prevent short circuits.

Equipment containing such batteries may be carried in checked or carry-on baggage.

Please note: There is no quantity restriction for spare Lithium batteries with a watt-hour rating of less than 100 Wh, they must be in carry-on baggage with the terminals insulated, however carry-on baggage limits apply.

The approval is issued by the undersigned on behalf of Qantas Airways Limited in accordance with the requirements of the ICAO Technical Instructions for the Safe Transport of Dangerous Goods by Air DOC 9284-AN/905 Part 8, the IATA Dangerous Goods Regulations 2009, 50th Edition Section 2, and the Qantas Group Dangerous Goods Manual Chapter 5, Operator Approval.

This approval is valid only on Qantas domestic and international flights from 5th March 2009 until 31st December 2010 inclusive. Any additional approvals required by international and national authorities for the carriage or export/import of the lithium batteries, from/to Australia is the sole responsibility of the passenger.

A copy of this letter must be carried at all times for confirmation to the airport staff.
